- *Think beyond the traditional color group of red and green for holiday gift wrappings; try light green and rich deep brown, or a monochromatic scheme.*
- *Collect tags, ribbons, ornaments, baskets, beakers, pots, etc., throughout the year and stash them away. When the holidays arrive, you won't be faced with last-minute panic and store leftovers.*
- *Check floral supply stores, art stores and superstore craft sections for package additions for the tops of gifts.*
- *If you don't have time to wrap each gift, stock up on inexpensive containers such as take-out containers, bakery boxes or paper bags that can be tied with gift cord or raffia.*
- *Collect dried flowers such as Queen Anne's Lace or poppy heads and spray paint gold for gift toppings. Also, save hemlock cones and glue into star clusters for gift toppings.*
- *Save good ribbons and refresh with an iron before reusing.*
- *Save elegant Christmas cards and recycle as gift tags or holiday recipe cards.*
